## VIGNETTES OF HISTORY

### INVASION OF QUEBEC

DECEMBER 31, 1775

THE INVASION OF QUEBEC ENDED AS A DISASTER FOR THE AMERICANS, BUT ARNOLD'S ACTIONS ON THE RETREAT FROM QUEBEC AND HIS IMPROVISED NAVY ON LAKE CHAMPLAIN WERE WIDELY CREDITED WITH

DELAYING A FULL-SCALE BRITISH COUNTER HEAVILY CRITICIZED BY BURGOYNE FOR NOT FROM QUEBEC MORE AGGRESSIVELY. DUE TO CARLETON WAS DISLIKED BY LORD GEORGE OF STATE FOR THE COLONIES AND THE OFFI-



THRUST UNTIL 1777. CARLETON WAS PURSUING THE AMERICAN RETREAT THESE CRITISMS AND THE FACT THAT GERMAIN, THE BRITISH SECRETARY CIAL IN KING GEORGE'S GOVERNMENT

RESPONSIBLE FOR DIRECTING THE WAR, COMMAND OF THE 1777 OFFENSIVE WAS GIVEN TO GENERAL BURGOYNE INSTEAD (AN ACTION THAT PROMPTED CARLETON TO TENDER HIS RESIGNATION AS GOVERNOR OF QUEBEC. DURING THE PARIS PEACE TALKS, THE AMERICAN NEGOTIATORS UNSUCCESSFULLY DEMANDED ALL OF QUEBEC AS PART OF THE WAR SPOILS. BENJAMIN FRANKLIN, PRIMARILY INTERESTED IN THE OHIO COUNTRY, WHICH HAD BEEN MADE PART OF QUEBEC BY THE QUEBEC ACT OF 1774, SUGGESTED IN THE PEACE TALKS THAT QUEBEC SHOULD BE SURRENDERED TO AMERICA; ONLY THE OHIO COUNTRY WAS CEDED.
